LOOKING AT OLD BUILDINGS (LAOB)

1. Visit to Lancashire Infantry Museum. Fulwood Barracks, Preston and Houghton Tower

Our tour started in the Waterloo Room where we were able to see many items from 1689 to the Battle of Waterloo. We passed through the Medal Corridor and the Somme Room where we saw items from the Boer War to the present day. The Council Chamber displayed some of the most valuable paintings and silver belonging to the Duke of Lancaster Regiment and The Garrison Church of St Alban which was completed in 1848. Houghton Tower, rebuilt in 1565 had many rooms full of stories about the family, the visit of King James 1 in 1617 which bankrupted the family, one where a young William Shakespeare was employed by the family as a tutor, one with a collection of Dolls' Houses of 19th and 20th century, the Grand Hall, the well and the cellars and finally the gardens. diary which appears each month on the LAOB Group Web Page. **Elizabeth and Ruth**

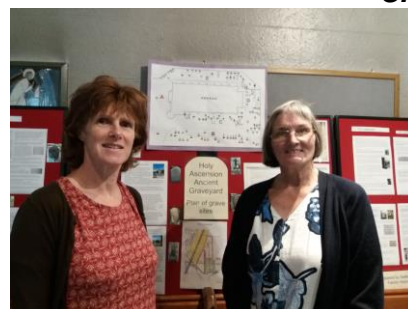
FAMILY HISTORY GROUP



Some members of the group have been involved in recent weeks on the Settle Graves Project at Holy Ascension Church. Concentrating on the ancient grave yard, couples took a portion of the gravestones, mapped them and transcribed as much as they could, gently rubbing the inscriptions to show up obscured lettering. Then Sally Waterson, Sarah Lister and Eileen Bamford put an enormous amount of time, effort and expertise into further research, planning, organising and updating the records and leading a further session of the group to set up the display. It shows the plan of the graves, who is buried and further information and stories about some of the people. There is also an "Ancient Graves Trail" to follow, with questions to answer and discoveries to be made.

We hope everyone will find time to visit the church and grave yard and view what has been done. It will be in the church for several weeks and is only the first part of the project.
