**FROM THE CHAIRMAN**

Dear Friends

My visit this month was to one of our newest groups Geology, led by Paul Cochrane, for whom the subject has been a keen hobby for 25 years or more. Paul's theme this month related to geological map-making, from the earliest known map (Egypt circa 1150BC) to the superb modern day Geological Survey series in a variety of scales, many of which form Paul's personal collection. The most popular now are the 1:50000 scale, producing very detailed sheets for the whole of the UK, 560 in total! For our area, the fracture lines of the Mid and South Craven faults, where millstone grit meets limestone, are clearly visible. Paul intends to arrange a series of field trips to notable sites within a reasonable distance and April's talk will explore in more detail how the Settle area came to be as it is today. The Geology group meets in Victoria Hall on the third Wednesday in each month.



The Yorkshire Post in its issue of 23 March, carried what I thought was an excellent article on the U3A movement, aimed at those people who know nothing of it and are perhaps put off by the word "university" in the title. My one issue was that it featured only Sheffield U3A, explained I suppose by the fact that theirs is the biggest in the country, with a membership of more than 2600 and with 160 interest groups! The author of the article did make the further points that :-

- we are valued by Government as older people, active in mind and body, make fewer demands on the NHS!
- most people find out about about U3A by word of mouth.

Perhaps we can rectify the latter point a little as Chris Stephens, our Publicity Officer, is producing a super range of eye-catching posters for our activities, which merit the widest distribution. the left hand side.

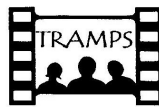
We hope to arrive by noon and lunch
