BIRDWATCHING GROUP



December took the Group to Leighton Moss and, for once, the weather was kind to us. The sun shone through thin cloud; the wind stayed away; and the birds put on a splendid show. The highlights were a singing Cetti's Warbler and first sightings for many of the group of several species including Marsh Tit, Teal, Greenshank, Snipe and Marsh Harrier. But the star of the show was the Water Rail which gave several group members their first-ever views of this very elusive species. And what views they were: the bird came so close we could have touched it! A wonderful experience to cap a very good day's birding. The only downside of our visit to this marvellous RSPB reserve was the tree full of roosting Little Egrets - which turned out, on closer inspection, to be a big flock of white doves. But you can't have everything!

GREAT LIVES

At our December meeting Sue Fisher gave a fascinating account of a lady, Violet Douglas-Pennant, whose life Sue has extensively researched. Violet was born in London in 1869, the seventh daughter of George Douglas Pennant, the second Baron Penrhyn and his first wife Pamela who died shortly after Violet's

birth. In 1886 her father inherited Penrhyn Castle in North Wales and sugar estates in the West Indies. Violet spent several years in India and during her thirties worked in London. From 1911-1918, she was head of the Pensions Office in Cardiff at a salary of £1000 a year, money she didn't even need, having her own private means. In 1918 she reluctantly accepted the post of Commandant of the WRAF only to be dismissed 14 weeks later on a charge of gross misconduct. Despite strenuously denying this, she was forced to leave her post. The rest of her life was spent, unsuccessfully, trying to clear her name. She died in 1945.

At our next meeting on Wednesday 16th January at 11.00 am, Ian Gray will talk about the life of Sir Edmund Hillary. Everyone welcome.
