Mathematical Puzzles: We have met twice per month throughout the 2006-7 session, and the assembled members at our 8 May meeting unanimously agreed that we deserve a long vacation. So there will be no more meetings of our group until the 2007-8 session.

Our puzzles have ranged very widely. We had great fun looking at the mathematics of bridges designed by Leonardo da Vinci. Two of our members made models, one in wood and string and the other in Meccano. We also studied lead balloons, but without models.

We've done some of the puzzles from *New Scientist*, and also touched upon Lagrange points and Sudoku. Recently we've been intrigued by a puzzle given to Arthur Lupton by Prof Gordon James of Austwick, which is to find whole numbers a , b and N which satisfy the equation:

$$\frac{a^2 + b^2}{ab - 1} = N \quad \text{e.g. } a = 1, b = 2 \text{ and } N = \frac{5}{5} \quad \text{or } a = 1, b = 3 \text{ and } N = \frac{10}{2}$$
