Dear Friends

My curiosity as to the workings of other U3A groups led me to the February meeting of Clitheroe U3A. It turned out to be the annual registration meeting in addition to a talk on Lancashire wildlife, so a kind of controlled pandemonium was evident!! Despite this I was made welcome by the Chairman, Alan Brookman, and we were able to exchange information on our respective group structure. With a similar size of membership to ourselves, Clitheroe has currently 22 groups and the annual membership fee is £20. Many groups meet in members' homes or in the local library, though the larger groups may need to hire premises for which a small additional charge is payable. The largest group, History - predominantly local history, has 65 members! Group subjects on offer include :- Antiques, Chess, Garden Study, Painting and Play Reading. If any Settle member thinks there might be interest locally for such subject groups, or indeed any other topics, please contact David Holdsworth, the Group Organiser.



Our Great Lives group is very much about mutual learning with no formal teacher/class set up. Each month a group member gives a presentation on a notable figure, living or dead, that particularly inspired them to do the necessary research. February's meeting saw an excellent talk by Vanessa Stone on Mary Seacole, a heroine of the Crimean War who had none of the social advantages of Florence Nightingale. Mary was black, born in the backwater colony of Jamaica and had little in the way of financial backing or formal training, but she was very much a battlefield area nurse in the Crimea. By giving medical assistance to wounded men virtually as they were pulled out of the firing line she was able to save many lives. Her popularity among the soldiers was at least the equal of the "lady with the lamp".

Great Lives meets on the third Wednesday of each month, with Jean Imrie as leader/facilitator.


